Chicago Engineers' Foundation- From President Sid Bennett

The mission of the Engineers' Foundation is to award scholarships and grants to encourage the study of engineering and to work with engineering educational institutions and high schools in the Chicago area in promoting interest in engineering as a career.

In June 2016 the Chicago Engineers' Foundation (CEF) made more than \$126,000 in Incentive Scholarship Awards to 106 high school graduates and continuing university students studying engineering. For students completing the four years of study, the awards amount to \$5,000. While this is only a portion of the expense of a modern education, our awardees tell us how meaningful the awards are for incidentals such as books, travel and living expenses, which are not covered by traditional grants.

With your support, in the last ten years CEF has awarded a total of \$769,000 to more than 400 collegiate engineering students from Chicago high schools.

For the past several years we have been conducting an outreach program to high school students (CEF High School Outreach Program) in which our volunteers visit high schools and give talks on engineering as a career choice, including highlights from their careers. We have seen a corresponding increase in the number of applications and in the quality of the students. Our awardees attend well-known universities locally and throughout the country, including Stanford, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, etc.

We are committed to expanding CEF's outreach efforts not only to graduating high school seniors, but future engineers of all ages. The CEF High School Outreach continues to grow with 30 schools visited in 2015, and 35 high school visited in 2016 with freshman, sophomores, and juniors. High school guidance counselors agree that an early exposure to career choices is essential in providing meaningful focus for the students in choosing courses of study and succeeding in their university studies.

One of the most satisfying aspects of our work is the contribution now being made by former awardees who are volunteering for outreach activities and contributing financially to the cause.

As an example, a CEF Board Director, Erik Cempel ('96) and a Board Advisor, Pat Maloney ('11), both of whom are past CEF scholarship awardees, participated in a Marist High School engineering symposium.

Approximately 170 students were in attendance to hear from Marist graduates working in engineering fields about college majors, internships, careers, and scholarship opportunities.

CEF volunteers also served as judges for the Union League Boys and Girls Club (ULBGC) Barreto Club Science Fair and similar events. We are looking for more similar opportunities and for additional volunteers. Come join us!

CEF also brought a slice of the tropics to the Club at our Caribbean Casino Night on Thursday, February 18. Music from the ULBGC Clemente Steel Drummers set the tone of the night as winners cheered at the poker, craps, roulette, and blackjack tables (fun chips only). More than 140 guests dined on Caribbean themed food and drink. The silent auction, the 50/50 raffle, and the wine grab bag raised \$12,000 for this year's awards.

We need your continued support to make sure that the Chicago Engineers' Foundation will be there, providing students a hand up and encouraging them, not just their first year at university, but throughout their college studies.







Chicago Engineers' Foundation Honors the 2016 Engineering Incentive Award Recipients

On Thursday, June 16, 2016, the Chicago Engineers' Foundation (CEF) honored 106 engineering students and high school graduates receiving the CEF 2016 Incentive Awards at its Annual Incentive Awards Banquet. Held at the Union League Club of Chicago, the event recognized the academic achievements of the awardees, as well as the support of their parents and teachers, and presented the monetary awards to the students to encourage them in their collegiate engineering studies. Attending the event were 240 guests, including the students, their parents and teachers, and supporters of the Engineers' Foundation.

The evening began with a light buffet dinner for the students and guests. Mr. Terry Hendrickson, President of the Union League Club of Chicago, and Mr. Sid Bennett, President of the Chicago Engineers' Foundation, welcomed the recipients and guests. Dr. James H. Oliver, Director of the Virtual Reality Applications Center and the Cyber Innovation Institute, and Larry and Pam Pithan Professor of Mechanical Engineering at Iowa State University, was the speaker for the evening.

Awards totaling \$126,900 were presented to 41 graduating high school seniors, 54 returning university students continuing their collegiate engineering studies, and 11 college graduates who have received their degrees in engineering. The 2016 Award Recipients represented 19 Chicago High Schools and 36 Universities.

In addition, the George O. Sinka Memorial Award was presented to Mr. Johan Villanueva for his exemplary commitment to community and country. Villanueva worked more than 266 community service hours during his four years of high school.

Dr. James H. Oliver, the Larry and Pam Pithan Professor of Mechanical Engineering at Iowa State University was the Keynote Speaker for the evening.

Villanueva states in his essay about community service: "enjoy involving myself in volunteering services when I have the time to help. Especially if it concerns the homeless or recycling, I gladly participate in those programs. Both of those are found in my school and I am part of both. Both have taught me that the general world needs help from everyone, so by volunteering one is doing their part. With the recycling program, along with members we go throughout the four floors of Lane Tech and take care of the school's recycling system on Wednesdays and Fridays. On Friday's students create plans on how to help the homeless situation in Chicago, and on Saturday's, the plans are executed as a group. The most common one is to go to a food kitchen and help serve and teach younger students in order to keep the program running. These two programs, called Homeland Helpers and Environmental Club, are two of the ways I am able to help my community."

We wish to thank all of our supporters of CEF Incentive Award Program who generously funded 106 individual incentive awards. We also thank the members of the Union League Club and our other supporters for making it possible to continue our mission.


