From the President

The Chicago Engineers' Foundation (CEF) of the Union League Club of Chicago had a wonderful year supporting the next generation of engineers. On behalf of our leadership and the CEF scholars, thank you to everyone who gave their time, talents, and enthusiasm to support more than \$120,000 in awards to 102 students. Our volunteers, donors, and friends make up an incredible community dedicated to providing scholarship awards and encouragement to aspiring engineers. We set high benchmarks and thanks to many stakeholders, we made great strides.



- **Community Outreach**—Volunteers visited more than 30 Chicago schools sharing their experiences as engineering students and in their professional careers. As the outreach program thrives, we continue to see scholarship applications increase and many amazing applicants. CEF scholars attend some of the best engineering schools both locally and across the country. Our leadership is also proud to include CEF alumni among our dedicated community of volunteers and donors.
- **Events**—The Foundation felt strong community support while presenting two fundraising events this year. We were honored to host one of the final American screenings of ***Bridging Urban America: The Story of Ralph Modjeski***. Guests enjoyed this amazing documentary profiling a master engineer and former ULCC member. The event also included an informative panel discussion featuring Dr. Alan Cramb, President of IIT, Daniel Burke, Deputy Commissioner of the City of Chicago Department of Engineering, Basia Myszynski, Co-filmmaker, and moderated by Chicago Tribune Reporter Mary Wisniewski. CEF also presented **Casino Night**, the Foundation's signature fundraising event. The Brazilian Carnival theme featured great food and drink, live music courtesy of Luminarts Cultural Foundation and Union League Boys and Girls Clubs, a huge silent auction, raffle, and fun casino games. CEF was honored with the support of many sponsors, ULCC member groups, and more than 400 guests at these two events that raised a combined total of over \$30,000 to support our growing incentive award program.
- **New Leadership**—CEF welcomes a new Executive Director to the leadership team. Debbie Birrell joined CEF in November. Ms. Birrell brings more than sixteen years experience in nonprofit management and fundraising to CEF, and has held positions ranging from program services and volunteer coordination to fundraising and executive management. She is a life-long Chicago area resident with a Bachelor's degree in Political Science and a Master's of Management in Nonprofit Administration. Debbie is honored to be part of the Chicago Engineers' Foundation community and looks forward to working with all of the stakeholders dedicated to supporting the next generation of engineers.
- **Strategic Plan**—The CEF leadership embarked on a strategic planning process to organize the Foundation around common goals, and articulate and prioritize strategies to help the organization continue to grow both now and in the future. This five-year plan follows best practices in strategic planning and involved input from all corners of the Foundation, the Club, and the sister ULCC foundations. 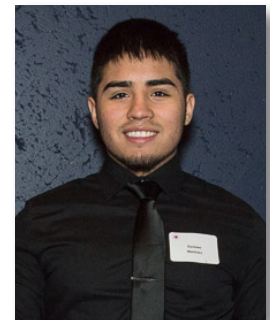

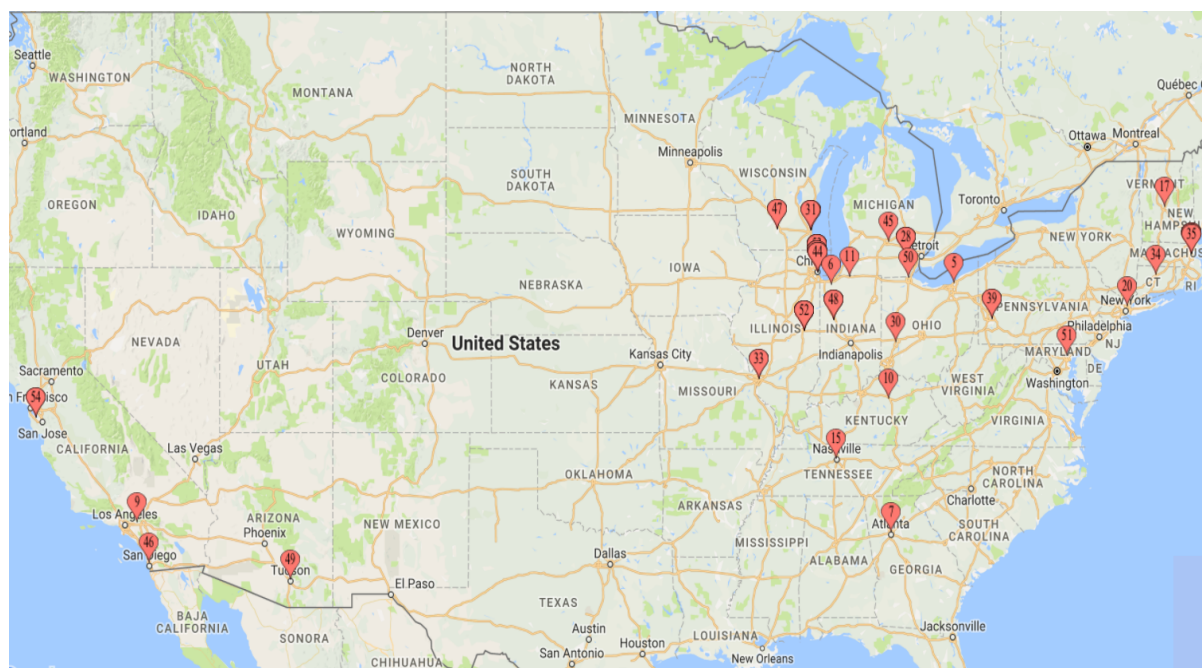

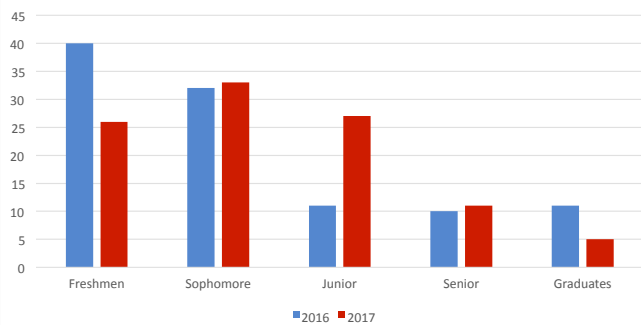
Monthly Contributions

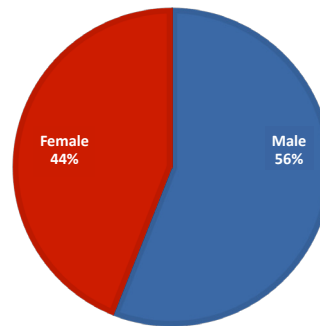
CEF by the Numbers

The Class of 2017 Includes CEF's Largest Group of Returning Award Recipients

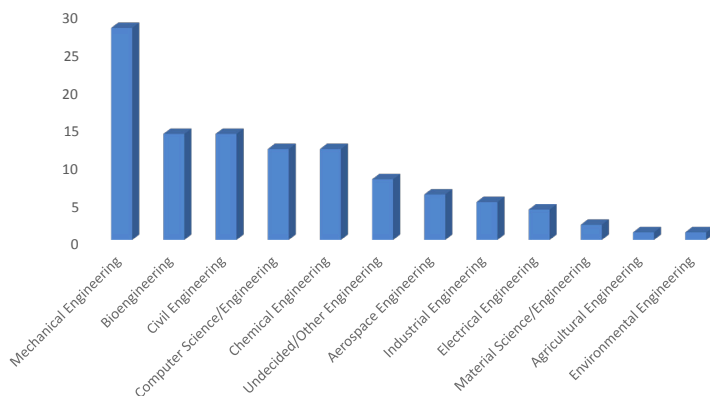
Award Recipients by Gender



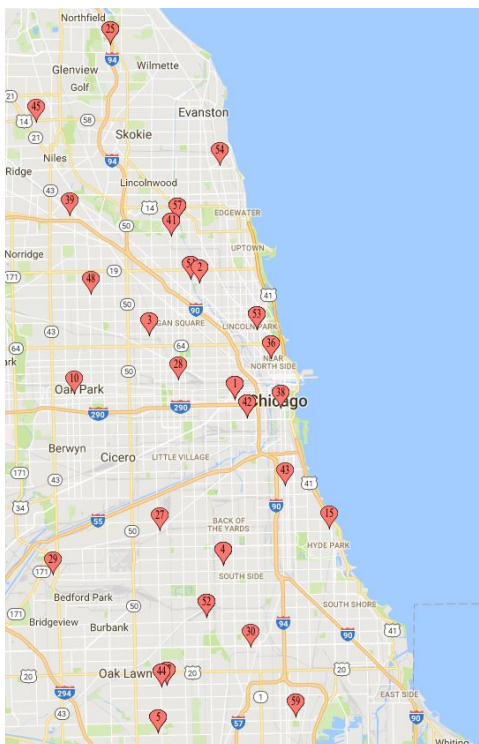
